

WASATCH BALLET'S SPRING CONCERT June 21 & 22, 2019

Since its inception in 2000, Wasatch Ballet has provided students with an exciting performance experience in front of family and friends that they anticipate with nervous excitement all year. A big part of the dance training process includes learning through performance. This experience helps build self-esteem, self-assurance, and contributes to a sense of confidence. Although performance opportunities can help prepare some students for a possible career in dance, they also contribute to children's success in non-dance activities. On-stage experience can result in better school presentations, improved social skills, and strong interview skills for future college or job opportunities. The rehearsal process is a tremendous learning experience as well. It helps the children develop retention skills, and by working with their classmates on a group performance, they learn the positive aspects of working as a team to create the best end result. Lastly, the most important benefit of the recital is the fun experience and the opportunity to make memories and friendships which will last a lifetime.

WBC offers students a professionally directed performance that allows dancers to demonstrate the results of a year's hard work, dedication, and progress. Our Spring Concert is a unique experience because each year, our studio presents an enjoyable, original Story Ballet. The students perform one to two numbers per class and are often involved in other scenes, helping the story-line along.



The Good, the Bad, and the Clever

- We will be performing one of Wasatch Ballet's beloved story ballets (with ballet, tap, and jazz), *The Good, the Bad and the Clever*. A favorite of many WBC families, it is an original ballet created by Allison T Wolsey and Stephanie Saul, with all original choreography by WBC's teachers and guest choreographers. It is loosely based on the novel, *Scrib*, and the movie, *The Good, the Bad, and the Ugly*. WBC premiered the ballet in 2008 and performed it again in 2012.
- The concert will be held at the beautiful Covey Theater at on June 21 at 7:00pm and on June 22 at 2:00pm and 7:00pm. Because of the larger theater, we will perform the concert three times! Students in Dance Expressions through Basics 2 will perform 2 times while dancers in Basics 3 and above will dance in all three productions. Casting (exact dates/times of your students' performances) will be announced in April.
- Almost every class will perform at least two dances, as well as participate in other parts of the story. Students who choose to perform will need to purchase one costume per class. As part of our commitment to strengthen our Jazz Program, jazz classes will only perform one dance this year. Because they only meet once per week, it isn't possible to clean two dances and continue to work on essential technique elements.

COMMITMENT

- **Every student and parent will be required to sign a Participation Form**, stating that they plan to be in the show and will be in class and at all of the rehearsals. **Due March 1.**
- **Mandatory Rehearsals and Performances:** Students must attend all rehearsals and performances. Please see details below. Full rehearsal schedules will be made available soon.
- **Class Attendance:** As we begin learning the choreography, it is essential for students to be in their class each week. It is hard on the student and the entire class when people are absent. Therefore, **students with excessive absences will not be allowed to perform.** Please make every effort to have your children in class so they will be ready to perform to the best of their ability. *If an absence is necessary, please phone the studio letting us know the reason and dates.*
- **Extra Rehearsals:** As we get closer to the show, it may be necessary to have additional scene rehearsals, especially the week before the show (the kids will be out of school).
- **It is not a requirement to be in the concert**, although it is hoped that everyone will want to perform. The students who choose not to be in the show can still fully participate in class and will continue to learn and have fun.

COST

Every effort has been made to keep the cost of the recital & costumes to a minimum.

WBC does not make a profit off of the costumes or the recital. Fee details are listed below.

- **Costume Fee:** Each student will need to purchase *one costume per class*, which they will keep after the show. The costumes will be creative, modest, and of nice quality and will cost approximately \$55-\$110, plus tax. If after ordering a costume, the student is unable to perform for any reason, they are still responsible to pay for the entire costume.
\$50 non-refundable deposit (per class) due by March 1.
Costume Balances due by May 1. Balance amount will be posted in April.
- **Recital Fee:** Pays for rental of the stage, lighting, and scenery. \$50 for 1st student, \$5 for each additional sibling. ***Due April 1.***
- **Tickets:** All ticket sales will go through The Covey Center Box Office. Seating is reserved, which is a bonus for our families. Tickets will be \$8 per seat and will be available through Covey Center Box Office starting in May. *Volunteers will earn one free ticket credit from each event for which they help.*
- **June's Tuition:** We will be having classes, rehearsals, and performances for the entire month of June, so it will be charged in full and is due the first of June.
- **Autopay:** Everyone currently enrolled in Autopay for tuition will automatically be signed up to use Autopay for concert costs. Amounts indicated on the Concert Info document will be withdrawn from your Autopay account on due dates without further notice. Please notify us if this is a problem.

Students will not receive their costumes until all money due for the year is paid in full!
